LONG TERM CONSEQUENCES

HINK BEFORE YOU



Creating or sharing explicit images of a young person is illegal, even if the person doing it is a young person. They are breaking the law if they:

CHILD PORNOGRAPHY IN THE LAW, YOU COULD BE

explicit photo or video of a young person, shared between young people of the same age SEXUAL IMAGES

BULLYING

UNWANTED

to get attention and connect with new people on

social media

DANGERS OF SEXTING No control of images and how they're shared. When images are sent they become public

BLACKMAIL

EMOTIONAL DISTRESS



If you posted something online, remove it as soon as you can

Ask anyone who has received it to delete it too

Talk to someone you trust, a family teacher, school nurse or other trusted adult
